

Welcome Kindergarten Families,

Thank you for continually working with your child at home to further their academics. We have seen tremendous growth in the students, both socially and academically. In this file, you will find some pertinent information about your individual student's academic placement compared to the rest of the class. We have included some activities that you could begin doing at home with your child to continue to help them progress academically throughout the rest of Kindergarten and over the summer to prepare them for First Grade.

Here are a few things that you can begin working on at home to enrich your child further...

- Reference the list of "High Frequency" words that your child has learned throughout the school year. (There are a total of 120 words they should know by the start of 1st grade.)
- Continue to work with your child on counting up to 100 out loud AND counting a set of 20 objects.
- Practice number reading from 0-20 in a random order.
- Practice addition & subtraction facts for numbers 1-10.

We have also included in here a 100's Chart for use at home as well as fluency math facts for 0 to 5 to continue practice of skills over the summer (see list of addition and subtraction facts to master).
